## CYF *(Children, Youth and Family Ministry)*

Welcome Back!!! September 12th is our official Kickoff of the 2021/2022 Sunday School year and we are so excited to see you all again! We have been working on creating and customizing a great curriculum for this year and look forward to sharing it with you all as we learn and grow together.

We will be starting our Sunday School year with a focused study on the Beatitudes (primarily in their version from the Gospel of Matthew's Sermon on the Mount). We will explore Jesus' timeless teaching through art, reflection, and discussion. This passage is full of wisdom that will enrich families and churches by exploring Jesus' vision of God's inclusive kindom (and our use of KINdom instead of kingdom to describe it), observing how Jesus turned expectations and traditional beliefs about being blessed upside down, and imagining ways to live into the promises of Jesus' Beatitudes.

One of our favorite things we are including with Sunday School this year are our Family Pages. The Family Pages consists of a central question, a brief overview paragraph with a practice that families can do together, a modified version of the Beatitudes Reflection from Sunday School, a coloring page and a prayer. These pages should help encourage conversation at home about what we are doing at church and our individual faith.

In our continued effort to find the best way to communicate with our families we are creating a Lakeview CYF (Children, Youth & Families) Google Calendar that will have details for each Sunday's lessons, attachments of any printable material, suggested reading and any bonus activities. On the Second Sunday of each month we will be doing something special (scavenger hunts, outdoor activities, group activities) so if you can only make one Sunday a month - those are great options!

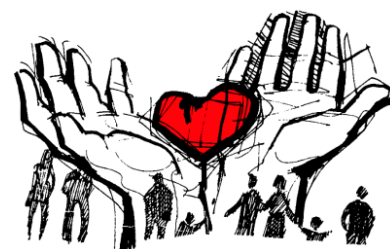

# ACTION IN MISSION—(A.I.M.)

The September mission is **Neighbors in Need**, a special mission offering of the UCC that supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. One third of this offering goes to the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). CAIM is the voice for American Indian people in the UCC. Historically, the forebears of the UCC established and worked with many Indian tribes in the plains and the Midwest. Today, there are 19 UCC congregations on reservations another American Indian congregation in an urban area. CAIM supports these churches and their pastors, as well as acting as a resource for members of these churches.

The other two thirds of our NIN offering is used by the UCC’s Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects. These include advocating in the areas of civil and human rights, economic justice, global concerns (Yemen, Ethiopia, Syria, Venezuela, Sudan, globalization, international trade and investment, etc.), environmental integrity, peacemaking, and racial jus-

**Rise Up** and raise our voices in support of permanent housing for women, men, and non-binary persons.

The National Coalition for the Homeless categorizes homelessness into three types:

- 1** **Chronic homelessness** are people who consider shelters as their permanent home rather than just an emergency arrangement.
- 2** **Transitional homelessness** pertains to those who go to shelters for a short period of time before transitioning into a more stable home.
- 3** **Episodic homelessness** are individuals who go in and out of the homeless situation due to their personal problems regarding mental health, unemployment, and substance abuse.

Did you know that approximately **17 people per 10,000** experience homelessness each day?

tice. A significant portion of grants awarded go to addressing issues of hunger and poverty, as well as projects supporting our immigrant neighbors and communities. Monies were gathered from a variety of sources, including the Neighbors in Need fund, and a Covid-19 relief fund was formed. While there is a deep respect in the UCC for the right of every individual member to form his or her own views on these issues, there has always been a passion across the church to “make things right”—as a testament to our faith in God and our love for God’s creation.

# Executive Council Meeting Minutes

Executive Committee Meeting, July 18, 2021

Present: Karen Baumann, Katie Madden, Corey Nieman, Todd Peterson, Jody McOsker, Steve Friedhoff, Will Huber, Sandee McAlpine, Molly Miller

Karen moved to accept minutes from 6-27-21. Second by Will. Motion passed.

Opening prayer was led by Pastor Todd.

Treasurer's Report- Karen Baumann

Karen announced that we were highly solvent. Karen added a line in the written report on operating expenses. It includes the balance paid to AXL for HVAC repairs. The amount was \$57,743.00. On June 15, we liquidated some P&G stock which netted \$5,148.79.

Motion to approve treasurer's report was made by Molly. Second by Will. Motion passed.

Building Maintenance- Katie Madden

Katie said we are at the decision phase for wall color (brick). The building committee has narrowed down the color choices to three. The executive committee will narrow the choices to two and then present the choices to the church.

On July 27, the building committee will meet with HuDawn to finalize start dates, the contract, and needed space. The work will start at the end of the second week of August.

Karen moved that we extend Katie's paid position through August. Second by Will. The motion passed.

Karen explained that we chose option 1 with Cornerstone. Option 1 includes \$200K loan, rate 4.75%, 5.5 year balloon note, payment \$1,043.29, amortization period 30 years (to coincide with the payoff of the 2009 loan)

We do not have to pay on the principal for 6 months, but we can if we want to. The first payment begins in the fall.

Karen will be calling Cornerstone regarding title insurance. She will find out how to get that. She will also notify the insurance company to let them know that we will now have two mortgages on the property.

Karen also explained how we will be paying for the work:

2022- A portion of the Burgett bequest of \$20,000.00

2023 plus 4 years- Cornerstone wants \$40,000.00 a year. We will do this with a capital campaign.

Karen offered to chair the campaign. This needs to be started in early 2022. Cornerstone considers it a successful campaign if you get 50% of pledged money upfront and the remaining 50% spread out over the next few years.

Karen suggested a congregational meeting to explain it all. Steve confirmed that the congregation does need to vote on the terms of the loan and to have a capital campaign. The congregation also needs to vote on the color for the brick.

The date set for the congregational meeting is August 15.

Steve announced that Harmony will be able to help with painting.

Katie announced that preschool parents have been painting the CE wing. Will motioned to paint over the mural of Jesus with the children. Second by Steve. The motion passed. The church will be able to replace the mural.

Committee Updates:

AIM- Sandee McAlpine reported that the collection numbers are good. She also would like to have a meeting in October to discuss missions for next year.

Also, Pastor Todd mentioned that the food barrels need to be replenished. He would like to send out reminders.

Jody announced that the free store food bank is looking for volunteers. She suggested that maybe a group would like to participate in this. This is a Monday-Friday activity.

Sandee also mentioned forming a group to help build beds for children.

Worship- Pastor Todd said that our goal is to be a church that functions online. He said that 50-100 people are logging in each week. We are trying to figure out how to reach out to online participants.

He also asked for volunteers to be involved in the worship service- music, reading, etc.

We have an app that people could use to watch previously recorded services. Hopefully this makes things technologically simpler. It's not ready for use yet.

We have phone grouping now. This is set up for people to call others who have mobility issues.

This allows them to be connected and engaged with the church.

It was discussed that maybe tech savvy members can go to homes to help people set up the app, etc.

Music-Pastor Todd is not sure when we can restart choirs. They are still on hold.

Discussion took place regarding the difficulties in getting rights to record music. We are keeping on file the music we have been allowed to record. What we can do online is different than what were allowed to do in the sanctuary.

CYF- Corey Nieman announced that we had our first playground fellowship. The next playtime is August 15.

September 12 will be the Sunday School kickoff. Also, on the second Sunday of each month there will be a bigger event at church.

Corey will be emailing lessons to families to be used at home.

Corey also mentioned that first aid kits will be stored in each Sunday School room.

Building use- Pastor Todd announced that the Cub Scouts is exploding in numbers. They want to use 9 of our rooms on Tuesday nights.

Other groups are looking to return soon.

Book group will be starting soon.

Safety protocols- Pastor Todd is tracking CDC updates.

We might set up a coffee fellowship outside.

Discussion took place regarding a grand reopening this fall. Pastor Todd suggested having a kick-off during worship time on September 12.

Steve announced that mailboxes needed to be cleared. If people don't want paper copies then they should let him know.

Motion to adjourn made by Steve. Second by Will.

Motion passed.

Meeting adjourned at 1:30.

# Congregational Meeting Minutes

Congregational Meeting, August 15, 2021

Executive Committee Present: Jody McOsker, Todd Peterson, Steve Friedhoff, Corey Nie-  
man, Karen Baumann, Katie Madden, Will Huber, Rosemary Ennis, Molly Miller

Total church members present: 38

Opening prayer was led by Pastor Todd.

Karen began the meeting with the treasurer's report which had already been sent out to the congregation. This explains the loan for \$200,000 from Cornerstone. The security from this loan is the church's income and funds from the Burgett estate bequest.

Karen then talked about the Burgett bequest:

The church is one of five charities. We have received \$50,000 in 2021 and late in 2020 we received about \$32,000. We allocated \$40,000 into the budget in 2021 and got \$50,000. The bequest is dispersed every April. We should continue to receive for 5-6 more years.

Cornerstone is asking for a capital campaign. If we have a successful campaign, Cornerstone will waive the requirements related to the Burgett estate bequest and will release any funds remaining in the demand account.

"Successful" means commitments totaling at least \$200,000 and 50% of that collected within the first year. That means we need pledges. The executive committee has proposed that the campaign begins in early 2022.

Karen has offered to chair the campaign and Corey has volunteered to be a member. More volunteers will be needed. Bob Sandman has offered to speak at various events regarding the campaign.

Right now we have \$66,000 in the checking account and \$20,000 in our savings.

\$40,000 has been paid out of pocket to AXL. We borrowed \$17,000 from Cornerstone.

Pastor Todd asked for questions.

Donna Maile: Regarding operating expenses on profit and loss, it looks like we paid \$67,000 more than budgeted through July. Does that include that \$40,000? Is that why it's high?

Karen: Yes

Donna: Is that \$44,000 or \$40,000 to AXL?

Karen: \$40,000 out of pocket.

Donna: What else is in that operating expense?

Karen: We are upgrading the internet, bills, insurance. I don't have other details with me. Katie has an initial bill from HuDawn that is for a down payment. We could pay that without Cornerstone getting the money to us.

Donna: What is the current Cornerstone mortgage? We've paid almost \$30,000 in seven months?

Karen: We pay \$4,213.90 each month.

Donna: Is that principal and interest?

Karen: Yes and we pay \$72.00/month on the line of credit.

Rosemary: To clarify, the money from the estate will be used starting next year at \$20,000. The other \$20,000 will be used to make our monthly payments. In the future the entire estate money each year will go to Cornerstone to make the payments. It looks like we'll get almost the entire \$200,000 from the estate, but remember we have to pay every month \$1,000 because the beginning of a loan is interest. It's in our best interest to raise money ourselves to start paying down the principal as soon as we can.

Karen: Either way, Cornerstone's expectation is that this gets paid off in 5 years.

Rob Schorry: So, we'll add another \$1043.00 and now the new monthly mortgage is \$5,300?

Karen: Yes.

Rob: That's a significant We need to ask ourselves if we can make it happen. In order to keep the building, we need to make it happen.

Karen: Also, please think of something else, that we have paid Katie that amount (\$1,000) a month and have been able to do it.

Pastor Todd: We want to be transparent. We want everyone to know what we're doing.

Fred Wood: A \$1000 a month isn't going to pay off a loan in \$200,000 in five years. Between the Burgett estate, \$1000/month, and the capital campaign, how are we expecting each compartment to pay for the loan?

Karen: The Burgett estate depends a lot on the stock market which has been holding. Currently there's \$1,000,000.00, divided five ways, divided over a period of time. I anticipate it will be \$40,000 distributed next April. Cornerstone wants a balloon payment of \$20,000 of that in 2022.

Jody: It's important to keep in mind the expenses. We need to consider how our membership is doing. We need that healthy base of donors. We need to be able to keep our programs going.

Fred: We're looking at a capital campaign of over \$200,000 in order for Cornerstone to give us the loan and to get commitments to have 50% paid for?

Rosemary: That's for them to release the estate. We don't have to raise the entire \$200,000. They're taking the money over the next five years from the Burgett estate, other than next year, and putting it into principal. The Burgett estate will reduce the principal, but we have to continue paying \$1000 each month.

Todd: It's in Cornerstone's best interest for us to be able to pay its debt.

Fred: So, if things go well, we pay \$40,000/yr which will go to principal. If the estate goes well, then the Burgett estate will pay for it. Why are we talking about a commitment for a \$200,000 capital campaign if the estate is going to pay it off? We will already be paying off \$1000/month on the mortgage which is only going to be \$60,000.

Karen: That's Cornerstone's security. Does the estate generate \$40,000/year? That's stock market gamble.

Rosemary: We don't have to raise \$200,000. If we do then we can pay the mortgage off much more quickly. If we raised \$100,000, then we could cover the monthly payments and pay down the mortgage more quickly and can pay off the mortgage in five years. We need to be sure we have the money to pay off the loan in five years.

\$200,000 is what Cornerstone wants us to do.

Fred: I think the campaign goal might be a little intimidating to some people.

Karen: I agree, but I think we can do it.

There was no more discussion.

Jody announced that we need to vote on the loan.

Karen moved that we accept the Cornerstone mortgage terms for the \$200,000 loan as presented. Second made by Betty Schorry. Motion passed.

Katie Madden gave a wall update.

HuDawn will begin work in middle of September. The Columbia Rd. side will go first. Second is the sanctuary drywall repair. Third will be the parking lot side.

HuDawn and Trisco will take a row of the parking lot. They will have their own dumpster. They will use our restrooms needed. Work will be done Monday-Friday during the day.

Katie listed some other things that need to be done. The cost of these things is unknown as of now. A hose spigot is leaking, so that will be replaced/repaired as well as moved. There are two spots on the hardy wall that need to be repaired. Katie also reminded us that we don't know what will happen when they open the wall. Everything is projected to be finished in 4-6 weeks.

Katie asked for questions.

Steve Friedhoff: In preparation for work on the Columbia side, there is brush that needs to be cleared. Rob asked that things be marked that need to be moved. Katie said we can mark the spots that still need work.

Katie then went on to discuss the colors. Moonlight white will be used as an accent color on the Columbia Rd. side with the cross window. The texture will be sand pebble fine. Katie explained that today's vote is for the color of the brick. The three color choices (which have been available to view at the church) are honey twist, adobe accent, or monastery brown.

Discussion took place regarding the color choices. It was pointed out that the color has to be decided before HuDawn can start. If we postpone the vote in order to have a professional come help decide, then that will push back the start date three more weeks. Karen called for the question on the 3 colors. People voted in the chat box. Honey Twist received 23 votes. Adobe accent received 6 votes. Monastery Brown received 0 votes

Rosemary mentioned that preschool hired a landscaper for the preschool area. The final results look nice.

Motion to adjourn was made by Rosemary. Second by Debbie Kumararaj. The motion passed.
