FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

It is hard to believe, but by the time you are reading this, we will have been together for three months. In some ways, it feels like we have only just begun. In others, it feels like so much life, ministry, laughter, and holy work has already been woven into these first months together.

One of the greatest blessings for me has been getting to know you one-on-one. Whether around a kitchen table, over coffee, sitting on a porch, or visiting at church, I have treasured hearing your stories—learning what you love about Lakeview, what has shaped your faith, and what you hope for in the days ahead.

On the home front, Tyler and I are also getting closer to being fully settled. We hope to be moved and living full-time in Milford by the middle of September, and I am very much looking forward to finally having both feet planted here and continuing to make this community our home.

This month we will bring our summer series, **"The Pastor's Playbook,"** to a close. First comes **"ImagAWEnation & InAWEvation,"** as we explore awe, wonder, imagination, and the Spirit's ability to help us see new possibilities. Then we will turn to **"Story,"** because our faith is, at its heart, a story—God's story, the stories of those who came before us, and the stories we are still living together.

That will lead us into something new beginning September 13: the **Narrative Lectionary**. A lectionary is simply a schedule of scripture readings that guides worship throughout the year. The Narrative Lectionary helps us move through the larger sweep of the biblical story in a more connected way.

We will begin in the Hebrew Scriptures, journey toward the story of Jesus, and then into the life of the early church. My hope is that we will not only hear individual Bible stories, but begin

to see how they connect—how themes echo across generations, and how our own lives are woven into this ancient and still-living story.

And perhaps there is no better time to begin a new journey than as the seasons begin to change.

Fall is trying very hard to arrive, although I must confess that I am usually the one grasping tightly to summer for as long as possible! Still, autumn has a way of making us think about transition. The light changes. Rhythms shift. Leaves remind us that creation itself knows something about letting go, changing, and preparing for what comes next.

Transition can be exciting. It can also be unsettling. Usually, it is a little of both. But our faith reminds us that change does not mean God has stopped working. Again and again, scripture tells the story of a God who meets people in the middle of transition and reminds them: *there is more ahead*.

As we enter this new season together, may God give us the courage to loosen our grip on what has been, the imagination to wonder about what might be, and the faith to trust that the Spirit is already at work among us.

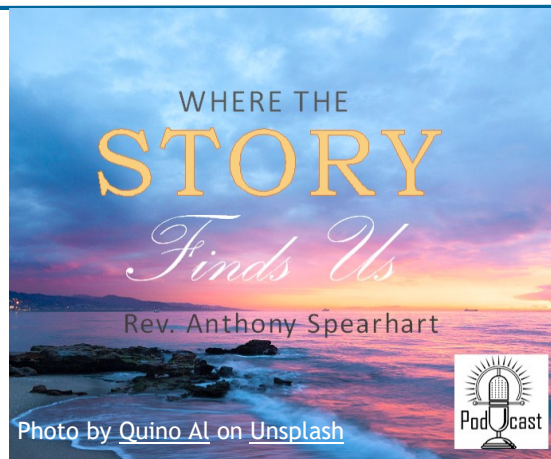
May you be blessed in every beginning, every ending, and every holy place in between.

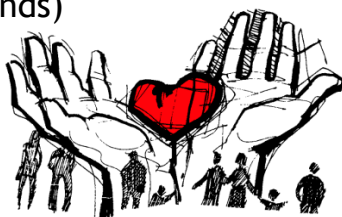

ACTION IN MISSION—(A.I.M.) September Mission of the Month

THE HAITIAN SUPPORT CENTER



Our Mission of the Month for September will focus on the crisis unfolding for Haitians in Springfield. As many of you know, Haitians in the US have lost their temporary protection status (TPS). There is a large community of Haitians in Springfield, OH. With a recent Supreme Court ruling, they have now lost their TPS status, are unable to work and are being deported, in most cases leaving family members behind, with no means of support. The Springfield community is in dire need of help from all of us. For the month of September, we will be channeling mission donations to The Emergency Fund for Haitian Refugees in Springfield. We hope for generous donations to send to Springfield.

Since September was our planned month for the all-UCC Neighbors in Need offering, you may still designate some of your mission giving to Neighbors in Need in September, if you wish. Just be sure to indicate the mission you choose to support when you make your offering. (Even though the Springfield Haitians are truly our “neighbors in need”, the UCC all-church offering, while supporting many other neighbors across the country, does not directly support the Springfield community.)

In addition, we will direct all non-perishable food donations to the Haitian Support Center in Springfield during September. Please see the list of urgently needed donations.

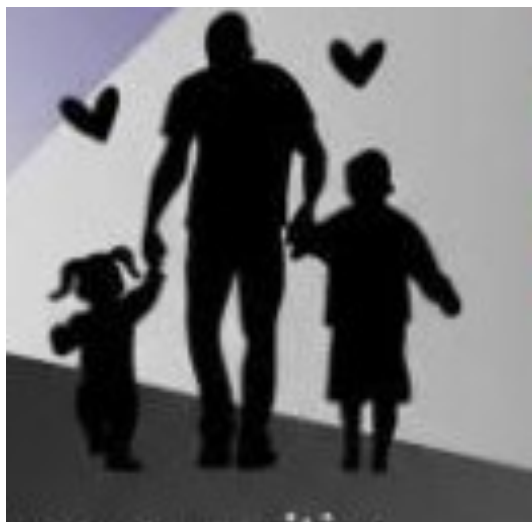

FAMILY PROMISE VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Family Promise provides temporary housing to homeless families while assisting them in securing permanent housing, employment, and other needed services. Lakeview assists host church St. Pat's Episcopal Church in Lebanon during their rotation week, and Lakeview handles Monday nights. This happens 4 times a year at the renovated facility on 600 Cincinnati Ave. in Lebanon.

Next Date: Monday, Oct. 19, 2026

Volunteers are needed to:



—Provide a dish for the evening meal (4 volunteers).

—Host the families during evening hours (about 5 p.m. to about 8:45 p.m.)—2 volunteers needed. This involves helping to set out dinner and clean up, as well as hanging out with the guests and maybe doing activities with the kids (bring a craft or art project if you wish, depending on the ages of the children).

—Spend the night—2 volunteers needed. You will have your own space to sleep. There are no real duties except to make sure everyone is accounted for, turn off lights and lock up the common area, and be there in case any emergencies occur (you will have emergency contact numbers). In the morning you are free to leave as soon as you need to.

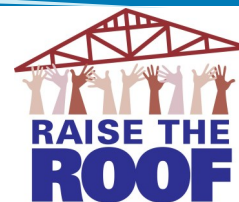

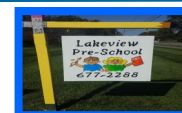
