FROM THE (FUTURE) PASTOR'S DESK

Beloved Church of Lakeview United Church of Christ,
 Grace and peace to you in the name of our still-speaking God.

What a gift this past weekend has been. I find myself returning again and again to the warmth of your welcome—the conversations, the laughter, the spirit of worship, and the deep sense that something sacred was unfolding among us. From the moment I arrived, I felt not like a visitor, but like someone already being woven into the life of this community.

Please know how deeply grateful I am—not only for the kindness you extended to me, but to my family as well. That welcome was felt in ways both spoken and unspoken, and it has stayed with us. My husband, Tyler, is especially excited to meet each of you. I've shared so many stories already, and he is eagerly looking forward to stepping into this community and building relationships alongside me.

Among the many, many things that have stirred my excitement about joining the Lakeview family, I found myself reflecting on what I was able to do after I left you on Sunday afternoon. After worship, after meaningful conversation, and after sharing lunch with some of you, I went to spend time with my twin niece and nephew at my nephew's tee-ball game. Being an uncle is one of the greatest joys of my life, and as I stood there, watching him play, As I chatted with my niece, it struck me just how close they will now be—only about 20 minutes from the church. In that moment, something felt deeply aligned. This call is not only about ministry, but about being rooted in a place where both vocation and family can flourish side by side. And that is a gift I do not take lightly.

As I begin to introduce myself more fully, one of the truest things I can say is this: I am, at my core, a storyteller. I experience the Divine through story, I understand Scripture through story, and I believe the Church is called to live and tell a story that is alive with grace, justice, and transformation. a *narrative theologian*—someone who listens for the movement of God not only in ancient texts, but in the unfolding lives of God's people today.

Because of that, I often speak about two ideas that are very dear to me—words I've created to describe how I believe God calls us to live as the Church: **InnAWEvation** and **ImagAWEnation**.

InnAWEvation is the sacred work of innovation grounded in awe. It is the belief that we are not simply called to maintain what has been, but to reimagine what could be...
not out of fear,
but out of wonder.

It is the courage to trust that the Spirit is still moving, still stirring, still speaking—and that we are invited to move with it.

ImagAWEnation is the practice of allowing our God-given imagination to be shaped by awe. It is the invitation to dream holy dreams, to see beyond what is, and to catch glimpses of what could be.

It is the quiet whisper that says: *God is not finished yet.*
It is the bold proclamation that says: *Neither are we.*

And when we live into both—
when we allow awe to ground our innovation,
and imagination to expand our faith—
we become a people who do more than remember God's story...
we become a people who *live it*.

These are not just ideas I carry—they are practices I long to live out together. Because I believe with all my heart that the Church, at its best, is a place where imagination is awakened, where awe is restored, and where lives are transformed.

Before I join you fully, I would be honored to extend an invitation to each of you. On **Sunday, June 7th**, I will be ordained into the ministry of the United Church of Christ. It would mean so much to have members of this beloved community present, if you are able, as we mark this sacred moment together.

And then—my heart already looks ahead with joy—to **June 8th**, when I will begin this new chapter among you.

Between now and then, the work begins for Tyler and me—packing up our lives, preparing our Wapakoneta home to be sold, and getting ready to move ourselves, our two cats, and our two Great Danes to the Cincinnati area. It is a season full of boxes, goodbyes, anticipation, and hope—a season of transition that is already beginning to feel like promise.

I look ahead with deep gratitude for what God has already begun among us, and with hopeful anticipation for all that is still unfolding.

Thank you for welcoming me so fully. Thank you for the beginning of what already feels like a meaningful and Spirit-filled journey.

MODERATOR'S MESSAGE

GOD IS STILL SPEAKING,

In the United Church of Christ, the phrase “God Is Still Speaking” is often used. It appears in our weekly church bulletin and in our monthly Lakeview Link. What does it mean? It means to be open, to listen, to be aware that old things pass away, that the new is ever upon us in our faith journey and that God uses a comma and never a period.

In the Old Testament God told the Israelites during their journey of wandering that something was happening. Were they paying attention?

-Isaiah 43:19-

*“See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?
I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland.”*

God always does new things; sending new ideas to nature and mankind. Are we listening?

On April 12 we said goodbye to Rev. Ruth Hopkins, our Interim Minister, who served us for eight months. Though we will miss her, she stepped away after helping prepare Lakeview for a settled pastor.

Our Settled Pastor Search Committee worked long and hard to prepare our church profile; part of the search process. In Fall 2025, the Lakeview UCC profile was posted, and little did we know that as *we searched* for a new pastor, *someone* had already *found us*. Anthony Spearhart had already been seeking a church to serve after being Bridge Pastor at St. Paul’s UCC in Wapakoneta, OH. When he found out about Lakeview, he knew that he could joyfully and with heartfelt devotion serve us.

After reviewing applications and interviewing several candidates the Search Committee voted unanimously to recommend Anthony Spearhart to the Lakeview Executive Council. The EC then unanimously voted to accept that recommendation. The next day I called Anthony on the telephone and extended the call to our pulpit. Anthony was so very happy and eager for the next step.

On Sunday April 19, 2026, Minister Anthony Spearhart preached from our pulpit. After the service we held a Congregational Meeting to consider if Anthony should become our Settled Pastor. We prayerfully discussed the proposal and then voted.

I am very glad to report that Anthony Spearhart was *unanimously* elected! He will join Lakeview on June 8, beginning his ministry with us on Sunday June 14, 2026.

See, I am doing a new thing!

New things and people always bring opportunities and possibilities. So let us all welcome Anthony Spearhart and his husband Tyler to Lakeview UCC, to Maineville and to our church community.

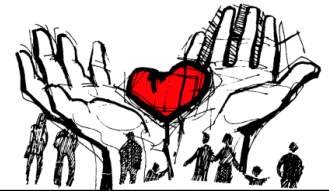

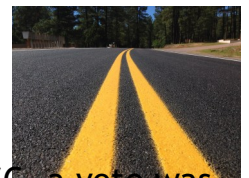

2025 Lakeview Capital Campaign

PAVING THE WAY- MAY 2026



On Sunday, March 16th, 2025, at the congregational meeting of Lakeview UCC, a vote was taken to extend the 2022 Capital Campaign. Now that the second mortgage has been paid off (February 24, 2025), extending the campaign will enable the church to gather funds for much needed property projects.

In a few years, the church will need the roof shingles replaced and that will also be a major expense. Due to the water damage from the ice dams in February we may need to absorb some of this expense that will not be covered by insurance (deductible, etc.).

So, prayerfully consider extending your commitment to the capital campaign. **As of April 7th, we have \$33,753.51 already.** Any gift is gratefully appreciated. Please remember to mark your gift "Capital Campaign" so the Financial Secretary, Julie Peterson, can place it in the proper designation.

STRENGTHEN THE CHURCH AND UNITED CHURCH HOMES

This year's theme for the **Strengthen the Church (STC)** Offering is "Sent Forth in Love." As members we have a shared commitment to cooperatively build up the UCC. Conferences and the national setting equally share the gifts given by members and friends through their local congregations. The funds raised support leadership development, new churches, youth ministry, and innovation in existing congregations. We are working together to build the church to come, preserving our future. By your generosity to this offering, you build up the Body of Christ. As God calls our congregations to be the church in new ways, your generosity will plant new churches, awaken new ideas in existing churches and develop the spiritual life in our youth and young adults.



Our 2nd Mission is **United Church Homes**, UCH began its mission at a time of ethnic discrimination, poverty, and pandemic. Over the years, people and situations have changed, but the mission has remained the same: to provide quality and affordable housing and healthcare options for older adults. Today, United Church Homes is a leading provider of healthcare and senior living services with a mission to transform aging by building a culture of community, wholeness, and peace for those they serve. In Dayton, UCH is currently fundraising for construction of the Longfellow Commons Community, which will convert a historical school and the rest of a city block into a place for members of the LGBTQ community and allies to call home and a safe place for them to belong in the community of others. Brimming with amenities like a theater, bodega, lounge, speakeasy, inspiration studio and fitness room, the community won't be shy about its abundance of life lived here. Progress has been made this year towards getting full site control of the 200 block on Salem Avenue and pursuing parcels on the 300 block as we consider needs for more parking etc. We are at \$8,013,682 toward our initial \$10 million goal.

Throughout the Month of May, donations will be divided 50/50 between these two missions, Strengthen the Church and United Church Homes Longfellow Commons Community project (you may choose to designate a different distribution, or choose only one, but you will need to make a notation when you donate.

CHANGING THE BOTTOM LINE FOR FAMILIES IN NEED

Traditional government assistance programs like SNAP and WIC don't cover the cost of diapers. **Sweet Cheeks Diaper Bank**, which is now a program of St. Vincent de Paul - Cincinnati, has been providing diapers to local families in need since 2015.

In 2025, Sweet Cheeks had the following impact:

- 2,271,603 diapers distributed
- 3,786 children served per month
- 46 distribution partners in their network
- 800,783 diapers donated to SCDB

Lakeview UCC has been supporting Sweet Cheeks from the beginning with an annual diaper drive and collection. **This year's diaper drive and collection will be May 31st.**

How can you help?

- Donate diapers of any size.
- Sizes 4, 5, and 6 as well as pull-ups are especially needed.
- Loose diapers are welcome, as long as they are in a zipped bag.
- Don't want to buy diapers? Our collection that day will also support Sweet Cheeks!

Let's join Sweet Cheeks in their mission: We believe every person deserves access to essential items like diapers and period products. When neighbors in need don't have access to these items, they miss out on school, work, and struggle to pay their bills.

FAMILY PROMISE VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Family Promise provides temporary housing to homeless families while assisting them in securing permanent housing, employment, and other needed services. Lakeview assists host church St. Pat's Episcopal Church in Lebanon during their rotation week, and Lakeview handles Monday nights. This happens 4 times a year at the renovated facility on 600 Cincinnati Ave. in Lebanon.

Next Date: Monday, June 15, 2026

Volunteers are needed to:



—Provide a dish for the evening meal (4 volunteers).

—Host the families during evening hours (about 5 p.m. to about 8:45 p.m.)—2 volunteers needed. This involves helping to set out dinner and clean up, as well as hanging out with the guests and maybe doing activities with the kids (bring a craft or art project if you wish, depending on the ages of the children).

—Spend the night—2 volunteers needed. You will have your own space to sleep. There are no real duties except to make sure everyone is accounted for, turn off lights and lock up the common area, and be there in case any emergencies occur (you will have emergency contact numbers). In the morning you are free to leave as soon as you need to.
